# ILLNESS PROCEDURES (FROM THE HANDBOOK)

Should your child become ill and unable to remain in school, the school will contact you. Your child will be separated from the other classmates until you arrive. A sick student CANNOT stay at school, and the parents/guardians are expected to make necessary arrangements.

Please do not send your student to school if he/she is not feeling well and cannot function normally. Children who have contagious diseases (fevers, severe coughs, rash, red throat, vomiting, or diarrhea in the last 24 hours) or who have not sufficiently recovered from an illness should remain at home. Please do not give your child Motrin, Tylenol, etc., and bring him/her to school. In most cases, the child will run a fever within two or three hours after the medication was given, therefore, making him/her contagious to the other students. Students with a fever of 101 degrees or above should not return to school until 24 hours after the student's temperature has returned to normal WITHOUT THE USE OF ANY medication.
